

Roots of Hip Hop in Ancient Cultures

Since its inception in 2012, *TRIBE-olution* has inspired audiences and reviewers with its exploration of the roots of hip hop in African, Brazilian (Capoeira), and Asian (Shaolin) cultures. Especially noteworthy are a Seattle Next50 award leading to a premiere performance of *Roots of Hip Hop in Ancient Cultures* at Seattle's Intiman Playhouse; a featured event in the 2012 NW Folklife festival recognized as "a high point" by Seattle Times reviewer Paul DeBarros; and a 2013-2014 4Culture grant for developing choreography.

TRIBE-olution is available in two programs: 1) a theatrical music and dance production, with interludes of acting/dialog arranged in scenes starting with street dancers in the mid-70's Bronx and proceeding with a series of flash-backs to ancient cultural scenes and flash-forwards to more contemporary hip hop scenes; or 2) a music and dance performance suitable for festivals and other venues.
